

Call for eCQM Testing Volunteers

Project Title: Misdiagnosis of Urinary Tract Infection in Women

Dates:

The Call for eCQM Testing Opportunity period opens in **February 2022** and closes in **June 2022**.

Testing begins in **April 2022** and closes in **October 2022**.

Project Overview:

As part of its measure development process, the American Institutes for Research (AIR) and the Infectious Diseases Society of America (IDSA) requests interested parties to volunteer to test the candidate eCQM, Misdiagnosis of Urinary Tract Infection (UTI) in Women for use in both inpatient and outpatient care settings. The goal of this measure is to correctly diagnose asymptomatic bacteriuria in the absence of UTI symptoms, and to reduce antimicrobial overprescribing, antimicrobial resistance, and Clostridioides difficile infection.

Type of Feedback Requested:

We are soliciting feedback on the feasibility of the measure's data elements, concepts, and the utilization of Natural Language Processing (NLP) for eCQMs. We are also seeking interested hospitals, health systems, primary care clinics, and ob-gyn clinics to participate as eCQM pilot test sites. This provides a unique opportunity to help shape and inform a quality measure by identifying any process gaps or needs before use in the public domain.
